Sharon Vogt's HB for her cholesterol.

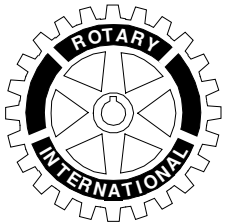
Waylandaires
